May Garden Tips

- May is the month for installing plant material. If you haven't already planted those summer annuals, let us help. If it's more than you can handle, we can pick up plant material that you've selected and bring it home. Most local nurseries will allow you to set aside the plants for pick-up. Just be sure to let us know promptly so the nursery doesn't have to keep them for long. You'll want them planted as soon as possible so that you can enjoy the show...all summer long.
- If you're planting annuals from seed, you probably already have them started. If not, it's okay to plant them now. Consider succession planting for color all summer long.
- We installed a drip system to water young plants around our own gardens. It's WONDERFUL! We aren't tied to the back end of a hose all summer. I guess you'd say we're now advocates for drip hoses because they have really made our lives so much easier.
- The seed package promised to electrify our garden with fiery bursts of color. It also said they were edible. So, we tried Nasturtiums last year. They were stunning in their brilliant reds and yellows. And, yes, we tossed them in a salad. They didn't have much taste, but the vivid colors sure made the salad look pretty.

PROGRAMS

Best of all, he will be a part of your installation team as your design is put into place. Unlike many landscape architects, he actually assists the crew as they install plant material to assure your new landscaping is as beautiful on your property as it is on paper.

Mulching: We apply a wide variety of locally available mulches for top dressing and plant protection purposes. Also, we stock pine straw mulch for a truly unique look.

Weeding: Weeding crews are available on an as needed basis or you may choose a regular monthly schedule. There are no minimum charges for the monthly maintenance program.

Edging: We create and maintain edges for landscaped beds and driveways. Also, ask us about permanent edging solutions.

Leaf Removal: Complete leaf removal service is available for your entire property. However, our large leaf vacuum can also assist you in removing piles of leaf debris you have prepared.
